

Dr Elwyn Griffiths has a PhD and a DSc degree from the University of Wales. Following postdoctoral positions at the National Research Council and McMaster University, Canada, he joined the staff of the MRC National Institute for Medical Research, London, where he worked for over ten years. In 1980 he became a senior member of staff at the National Institute for Biological Standards and Control, UK. In 1994 he was appointed Chief, Biologicals, at the World Health Organization, Geneva, where he was responsible for WHO's international programme in biological standardization for assuring the quality and safety of vaccines, blood products and biological therapeutics, including biotechnology derived and gene transfer medicinal products. Dr Griffiths has published widely in the biologics field and has been heavily involved in providing scientific and regulatory advice to the UK Medicines Control Agency, the EC Committee on Proprietary Medicinal Products (CPMP) and the WHO concerning products derived by novel biotechnologies, and in developing European Union and WHO guidelines on the quality and safety of vaccines and biotechnology derived medicines.
