

Julio Baez, Ph.D. is a Senior Research Fellow with FibroGen, a biotechnology company committed to production of recombinant collagen and gelatin, responsible for development of transgenic systems for gelatin production. Previously as VP of research and founder of Integrated Protein Technologies (a unit of Monsanto), Dr. Baez lead a team to produce the first injectable monoclonal antibody used in an FDA approved clinical trial produced using a transgenic system (corn seed). He also led teams and conducted research for the production of biotechnology derived products for chemical, pharmaceutical and agricultural uses as part of his 20 year industrial experience in Monsanto, Ethyl, and Upjohn. In had been involved in curriculum development for applied biotechnology for extension divisions at Washington University - St. Louis, Northwestern University, UCSD, and Stanford University. He is currently in the biotechnology advisory board of the University of Puerto Rico and a member of the scientific advisory board of the plant biotechnology company UniCrop. He has a PhD in Biochemistry from the University of Illinois and BS in Chemistry from the University of Notre Dame.
